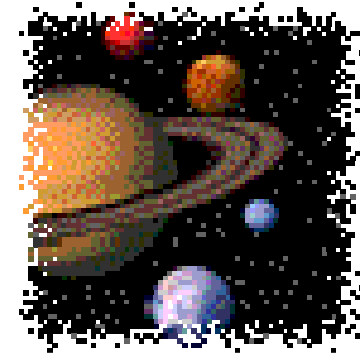
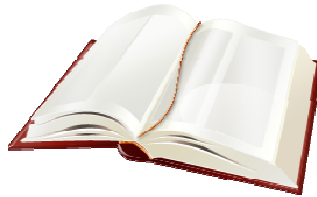

Broomfield Academy Summer Enrichment Camp

Students in the Summer Enrichment Camp will enjoy four two-week sessions focused on fun and educational arts- and science-related topics. On alternating Fridays, students will present a special culminating project or event focusing on the session's theme.



There will also be daily time devoted to arts and crafts, free time, and caring for the garden. In addition to thematic field trips, students will also enjoy summer activities at places such as The Broomfield Bay, Chippers bowling lanes, Pump It Up and Jungle Quest.

June 3rd — Camp begins

June 7th — June 18th Music/Drama Camp


Field trips will include Ballet Nouveau and the Arvada Arts Center. Each day will be devoted to topics such as vocal music, instrumental music, acting-related skills and techniques. The children will participate in a dramatic performance that incorporates learned music and drama techniques on June 18th from 3—4 p.m.

June 21st — July 9th STEM (Science Technology Engineering and Math) Camp

Field trips will include NCAR (National Center for Atmospheric Research), the Planetarium, and the Denver Museum of Nature and Science. Each day will include the use of STEM tools for experiments, data collection, and research. On July 9th, students will host a science fair for families from 3-4 p.m.



A look at a typical day

9:30—11:30am	Camp theme activities
11:30—12:30pm	Lunch and recess
12:30—1:00pm	D.E.A.R. time (Drop Everything And Read) or teacher-led reading 
1:00—3:00pm	Elective classes. Students not enrolled in elective classes continue with the theme of the week.
3:00—4:00pm	Outside water games and play
4:00—5:00pm	Snack and activities
5:00—6:00pm	Free play and recess

July 12th — July 23rd Visual Arts Camp

The children will go on 1-2 field trips each week to places such as The Boulder Museum for Contemporary Art and the Denver Art Museum. Each day will be devoted to a different art medium. On July 23rd, from 3-6 pm, we will be hosting an Art Gallery for families to enjoy.



July 26th — August 6th Adventures in Literacy Camp

Field trips include such places as The Tattered Cover bookstore and author / illustrator programs. Each day will include time to enjoy group readings of classic and contemporary authors, writing and editing time, and public performance of writing pieces. On August 6th, we will host an open mic performance for our young writers from 3-4 p.m.

Lunch and snacks: Children should bring a healthy lunch and drink each day. Microwave ovens are available for heating lunches. Morning and afternoon snacks will be provided.

Elective Classes

We offer a variety of special classes. This summer's classes will include soccer, chess, Science of Star Wars, cooking and rocketry (see attached for a complete list).



Minimum enrollment: Four students per class. Electives are open to all students regardless of camp enrollment.
